Summer Safety



Sun Protection

It is so important to keep sun exposure to a minimum during the summer months. It can be hard to resist when it is so beautiful outside. Remind parents to bring sunscreen, hats and light weight clothing that will cover exposed skin.



Bugs

Bug bites lead to itchy skin and worst case, diseases. Use insect repellents that contain DEET to prevent insect related diseases. Depending on the bug, bites can lead to Lyme Disease, West Nile, Zika Virus and more. Ask parents to pack preferred repellents if you plan to go outdoors.



Dehydration

Dehydration can sneak up on anyone, especially children. It can be hard to stop adventure seeking and creative play. Make sure your kids are getting lots of water throughout the summer months. Children 5-8 should consume about 5 cups of water per day.



Water Activities

Always make sure there is adult supervision in any situation that includes children and water. Make sure to reapply sunscreen as instructed. Even if the bottle says waterproof, adding an extra layer every two hours helps to prevent sunburn.

Making Ice Cream

Science with a cherry on top!

Ingredients:

• Base Ice Cream:

2 cups whole milk 1/2 cup granulated sugar 1 tablespoon vanilla extract 10 cups ice 8 tablespoons rock salt

• Mint Chocolate Chip:

1 tablespoons mini semisweet chocolate chips 1/4 teaspoon peppermint extract

Chocolate:

1 tablespoon unsweetened cocoa powder

• Strawberry:

1 tablespoons chopped strawberries (from about 2 strawberries)

Directions:



For the base ice cream: Stir the milk, sugar and vanilla together in a medium bowl. Pour 1/2 cup of the mixture into a sandwich-size resealable plastic bag. Make vanilla ice cream or add in your desired flavors. Tightly seal the bag. Put that bag into another sandwich-size resealable plastic bag and tightly seal. Repeat with the remaining batter and desired flavors.



Place the ice and the salt into a
4-quart food storage container with a lid.
Put the filled bags into the container and secure the lid. Shake the container until the mixture is frozen and resembles ice cream, about 5 minutes. Remove the bags with the ice cream in it from the outer bag and snip a large piece off one corner of each bag. Pipe the ice cream into small bowls or cones.



Rainbon Foam

Sensory play starts here!

Directions:

You can easily set this up in a large bin and have kids play with hands. Add plastic figurines or water safe toys for small world play!

Supplies:

- 1/4 Cup Tear Free Baby Wash
- 1/2 Cup Water
- 2 Tbsp Flour
- Large mixing bowl
- Hand mixer
- Food coloring (use the gel ones for vibrant colors)



Add your baby wash/soap, water, flour and as many drops of food coloring as you'd like (depending on intensity of color you want) to a large mixing bowl.



Whip on medium then high speed until stiff peaks form.

If the foam begins to dissipate, mix again to keep it fluffy.

Note the recipe above is per large mixing bowl. If you make 6 rainbow colors, you will need enough to make the above recipe x 6.

There is a \$40 service charge for returned checks.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

Please call 301-290-0040 in advance of class if you need assistance or require special accommodations.

All classes are open to the public.

CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

You will receive a call notifying you of the cancellation and your money will be refunded or a credit will be issued.

LOCATE: CHILD CARE



LOCATE: Child Care

If you are a licensed child care program or family child care provider, you can take advantage of this free method of advertising by keeping your LOCATE database record current.

Report changes to your fees, email, hours, and etc.;

Report vacancies.

Request a database questionnaire; Leave a question and someone will call you back. Call toll free 1-866-752-1614—provider message service.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well. Training Descriptions:

6/6—Multiple Intelligences: Discovering Gifts & Empowering Children:

This training introduces participants to the theory of Multiple Intelligences and innovative teaching ideas which will assist in making their classroom an enhanced learning environment for children of all abilities. Participants will learn to identify the unique learning strengths of children and how to apply practical strategies to promote inclusive and empowering learning opportunities for all.

Time: 6:30pm-8:30pm, COK: 1 hour curriculum and 1 hour special needs Fee: \$25 for members or \$30 for non-members

6/8— Medication Administration

This training course is a 6-hour competency-based class approved by MSDE/OCC to train child care providers to safely administer oral, topical and emergency medication to children in a child care setting. Upon successful completion of this course each participant will receive a certificate of completion which will allow the participant to administer MSDE/OCC approved medications to infants, toddlers, preschool and school aged children in child care centers and homes. You must pass a pre and post test. You may bring lunch or go to a fast-food restaurant in the area. Time: 9:00am-4:00pm, COK: 6 hours of health, safety, and nutrition Fee: \$65 for members and non-members

6/10—Including all Children and the Americans with Disabilities Act ADA

This training will go over the requirement of the ADA and inclusionary practices in early childhood and school age programs. Also, learn about local, state and national resources available to child care providers.

Time: 6:00pm-9:00pm, COK: 3 hours of special needs

Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members

6/12—Creating Preschool Coding Stories and Games

Coding stories and coding games are playful, hands-on ways for children to explore and experiment with early coding. They offer opportunities for interactions and collaborative learning. If coding is new to you, you will find that it builds on many early math and literacy concepts you are familiar with.

Time: 6:30pm-8:30pm, COK: 2 hours of curriculum Fee: \$25 for members or \$30 for non-members

6/15—CPR and First Aid

Participants will be trained in CPR for the infant, child and adult. This class meets the Maryland Child Care Administration's requirements for child care facilities.

6/17—Jumping Into Science

Many of the habits of scientific thinking are inherently part of children's play. Participants will explore the importance of developing scientific thinking skills in young children and how they can support those skills with simple materials. Training Descriptions:

7/8—"I Love You Rituals" and Other Routines for Infants and Toddlers

Training Descriptions:

8/1—Why Play Matters

This interactive training will seek to build participants knowledge and understanding of the importance of play in the physical, cognitive and social development of children. This training will discuss the various aspects of play and the roles that each type plays in the growth and development in children. This training will conclude with discussing strategies for integrating developmentally appropriate practices into curriculum and daily activities to meet the individual needs of children.

8/3—Medication Administration — OCC Requirement
