BEAT THE SUMMER HEAT WITH WATER PLAY



Change things up with a water table!

Create a new sensory bin with water, orbies, or any item able to get wet! Grab some seashells or waterlife figurines and make it educational at the same time. The possibilities are limitless!



Use ice cubes for play!

Create fun shapes with ice trays or use food dye to color them for a fun painting exercise! Also, try filling water balloons with water and freezing them. Peel the balloon away after frozen, and you have amazing ice balls for kids to play with! They are great for the water table or rolling along a warm sidewalk or driveway.

BUS STOP SAFETY

Safety Starts at the Bus Stop

Your child should arrive at the bus stop at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive. Visit the bus stop and show your child where to wait for the bus: at least three giant steps (six feet) away from the curb. Remind your child that the bus stop is not a place to run or play.

Get On and Off Safely

When the school bus arrives, your child should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop, the door opens, and the driver says it's okay before approaching the bus door. Your child should use the handrails to avoid falling.

Use Caution Around the Bus

Children should never walk behind a school bus. If they must cross the street in front of the bus, tell him/her to walk on a sidewalk or along the side of the street to a place at least five giant steps (10 feet) in front of the bus before crossing. Have them make eye contact with the bus driver before crossing to make sure the driver can see him/her.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

All classes are open to the public.

CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center **24-hours in advance** and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. ***Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration** or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

You will receive a call notifying you of the cancellation and your money will be refunded or a credit will be issued. Credit must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

LOCATE: CHILD CARE



LOCATE: Child Care If you are a licensed child care program or family child care provider, you can take advantage of this free method of advertising by keeping your LOCATE database record current. Report changes to your fees, email, hours, and etc.; Report vacancies. Request a database questionnaire; Leave a question and someone will call you back. Call toll free 1-866-752-1614—provider message service.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child. Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well. Training 8/1—Why Play Matters

This interactive training will seek to build participants knowledge and understanding of the importance of play in the physical, cognitive and social development of children. This training will discuss the various aspects of play and the roles that each type plays in the growth and development in children. This training will conclude with discussing strategies for integrating developmentally appropriate practices into curriculum and daily activities to meet the individual needs of children. Time: 6:30pm-8:30pm, COK: 2 hours of child development Fee: \$25 for members or \$30 for non-members

8/3—Medication Administration — OCC Requirement

This training course is a 6-hour competency-based class approved by MSDE/OCC to train child care providers to safely administer oral, topical and emergency medication to children in a child care setting. Upon successful completion of this course each participant will receive a certificate of completion which will allow the participant to administer MSDE/OCC approved medications to infants, toddlers, preschool and school aged children in child care centers and homes. You must pass a pre and post test. You may bring lunch or go to a fast-food restaurant in the area. *Time: 9:00am-4:00pm*,

Fee: \$65 for members and non-members

8/5—A Play on Literacy

A Play on Literacy discusses the literacy developmental milestones for ages 6 months through 5 years. It is an in-depth training on how to implement literacy into the classroom environment for more meaningful activities, and how to assess children's literacy development. It also includes information on how to implement adaptions for children with disabilities. Time: 6:30pm-8:30pm, COK: 2 hours of curriculum Fee: \$25 for members or \$30 for non-members

8/7-Sensory Play for Infants and Toddlers

Sensory play enables infants and toddlers to scaffold learning, building on prior experiences. Providers will learn how to use non-traditional everyday sensory items to create discovery baskets to scaffold memory and enhance brain development in Infants and Toddlers. Time: 6:30pm-8:30pm, COK: 2 hours of curriculum Fee: \$25 for members or \$30 for non-members

8/13—Kindergarten Readiness for the Child Care Community

Training

9/12—Understanding Autism Today

Child care providers are key players in creating awareness of Autism and can offer support and guidance to families and children with Autism Spectrum Disorder. Participants will hear about recent developments in Autism research, learn to identify early warning signs of autism and find local support resources as well as learning effective teaching and documentation strategies for supporting children with Autism Spectrum Disorder.

Time: 6:00pm-9:00pm, COK: 3 hours of special needs Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members

9/14— Emergency and Disaster Preparedness

This six-hour workshop meets the OCC requirements for Emergency Preparedness training. Participants will complete an approved emergency preparedness plan in the workshop. Time: 9:00am-4:00pm, COK: 6 hours of health, safety, and nutrition

Time: 9:00am-4:00pm COK: 3 hours of health, safety and nutrition and 3 hours of professionalism

Fee: \$50 for members and non-members

9/16—More Than Twinkle Twinkle: Using Music with Infants and Toddlers

Music and movement is a fun way to help infants and toddlers increase vocabulary and build muscle tone and social connections. This workshop explores the many ways in which music and movement for infants and toddlers can be incorporated into classroom as well as individualizing music and movement to meet the needs of individual children in your program. *Time:* 6:00pm-9:00pm, COK: 3 hours of curriculum Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members

9/19—Working Together: Community and Its Helpers All Around Town

This course is designed to introduce child care providers to Community/Social Studies through community helper in Early Childhood Education for children birth through 8 years of age . *Time: 6:00pm-9:00pm, COK: 3 hours of community Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members*

9/24—Planning the Day for Infants and Toddlers

An infant and toddler's day is full of routines and experiences. In this session, we will discuss how to implement these routines and experiences appropriately. Participants will also have an opportunity to explore and analyze daily schedules and lesson plan formats for infants and toddlers. They will also review and find resources to assist them in planning developmentally appropriate activities. *Time:* 6:00pm-9:00pm COK: 3 hours of curriculum *Fee:* \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members

9/26—CPR and First Aid

Participants will be trained in CPR for the infant, child and adult. This class meets the Maryland Child Care Administration's requirements for child care facilities.

Time: 6:00pm-10:00pm, OCC Requirement Fee: \$75 for members and non-members

9/28—Managing Stress at Any Age

This training is designed to increase participants' knowledge of stress and how to manage its symptoms. This training introduces participants to "good" and "bad" stress as well as other types of stress such as acute stress and post-traumatic stress disorder, and participants will learn initial signs and symptoms of each type of stress. The participants will also be able to examine the similarities and differences of stress in infants, toddlers, preschool children, school-aged children, adolescents and adults. *Time: 9:00am-12:00pm, COK: 2 hours of health, safety and nutrition 1 hour* of professionalism

Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members

9/28—Creating a Stress Reduced Environment for Children of All Ages

Stressors in children, ages 2 through 12; what the stressors are; how these stressors can be addressed. The purpose of this training is to look at the increasing level of stress found in children ages 2 through 12, and what can be done to help these children cope with their stress and anxiety. The areas that will be presented include: what causes stress, how young children exhibit stress, what techniques child-care providers can use to help lessen that stress, and how to establish collaboration between providers and parents to reduce the impact of stressors on young children . *Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm, COK: 1 hour of child development, 1 hour of curriculum and 1 hour of health, safety and nutrition Fee: \$30 for members or \$35 for non-members*

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
