HOW TO TREAT BUG BITES AND STINGS

Bug bites are inevitable during the summer time. If you're like me, you have to pack a bottle of bug spray everywhere you go. When I don't, I always end up covered from head-to-toe with itchy spots that just seem to last a lifetime. So, I have set out to find a solution to treating bug bites for everyone in your family.

According to Children's Health, "to treat a sting, first ensure you have removed the stinger by gently rubbing a flat object like a credit card across the sting. Next, clean the sting or bite site with soap and water and apply an antibiotic cream. You can help your child with pain by putting ice on the site. If your child was stung on the arm or leg, they can elevate that limb to help reduce swelling. Many insect stings and bites itch afterward. You can apply bug bite or antihistamine lotion to the site to help stop itching. You may also give your child an age-appropriate dose of acetaminophen or an antihistamine to help with pain and itching. Most symptoms of bug bites should pass within a few hours or days. However, if swelling, redness or pain gets worse – or if your child experiences a fever, rash or fatigue – contact your child's pediatrician."

While we can treat bites and stings, prevention is key. To prevent bites and stings, Children's Health suggests:

- Don't let them wear bright clothing outdoors.
- Avoid using heavily scented soaps or sweet-smelling perfumes and lotions.
- · Ensure they wear shoes when playing outside.
- · Cover arms and legs as much as possible.
- · Spray them with a children's insect repellent.



Children tend to react to disaster and traumatic events based on their past experiences and what they know of the current situation. Participants will learn how to help children cope with trauma and how to respond to children who have experienced trauma.

Use coffee filters, food coloring, and pipe cleaners to create colorful butterflies. Open the coffee filter, drop some food coloring on the coffee filters (optional: use a little bit of water if you want to spread the food coloring), pinch in the center, and use the pipe cleaners to wrap around the center and create the butterfly's body.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering webinars to our clients. Webinars will be announced on our training calendar and posted on our website.

Currently, we are not accepting cash, checks, or money orders. You may call with a credit card to pay over the phone. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at thepromisecenter.org/register. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot.

Confirmations will not be mailed. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For our webinars, class participation is required. You must have video and microphone capabilities. Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending the class. Certificates will be mailed upon completion of the assessment.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

Please call 301-290-0040 in advance of class if you need assistance or require special accommodations.

All classes are open to the public.

The Promise Resource Center provides low-cost workshops for child care providers, parents and the community. Our workshops meet MSDE/Office of Child Care requirements for Core of Knowledge training.



CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

You will receive a call notifying you of the cancellation and your money will be refunded or a credit will be issued. Credit must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. You can update your record now at https://locate.marylandfamilynetwork.org/Provider/login. Once you enter your information, it will be reviewed and activated in our database within just two business days. Everyone who updates their record will receive an entry in our monthly drawing for a \$25 Amazon gift card. LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are

recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well.
