"Experts on early childhood development agree that the basic skills of reading, writing and math are no longer enough – children also need to learn to think critically if they're going to be successful in today's complex world. " ~The Hanen Centre

During a child's third year of life there will be a surge in the cognitive development. Their language has developed, they will start asking questions, they will want to know "why?", and they will be working on problem solving and finding the answers themselves. Before that third year, adults can support the development of thinking skills in several ways, all rooted within the relationship you have developed with them.

Exploration

Infants are naturally curious, they work to understand their world through their senses and are ready to explore everything around them. As you provide interesting items for children to explore, describe the experiences you see them engaging in and get excited with them as they make new discoveries, (even when they find their toes). As you interact with children you can also help them solve problems that they encounter, not by doing it for them, but by encouraging them to try. This could mean helping them reach an object or open a container to get what's inside. Make sure you give them a chance to do it on their own, then provide just enough support for them not to get frustrated in their attempts.

Development and Learning

<u>Memory</u>

As you engage a child in a fun filled game of "Peek-a-Boo" you are encouraging the development of object permanence and when children explore objects in different ways they are discovering cause and effect. Encourage children to touch and bang and shake and roll, again, describing the child's own experience with these items as they discover what they can do with the things around them.

Problem Solving ...

"is a critical thinking skill that helps babies be successful now, later in school, and the rest of their lives." ~Zero-to-Three

To encourage the development of problem solving skills, pay close attention to what the child is trying to do, and support them in that endeavor. Are they trying to get to an object, just our of reach? Encourage them to keep trying, then give a bit more support by moving it a little closer. The key is to provide enough support to make sure they don't get frustrated and give up, but not to do it for them completely.

Birth to Three Years

Exploring Differences

As children explore items they will start to notice the difference in how things feel, sound, look, or taste. Engaging in that exploration with them, describe the feel, the sound, what it looks like, and as they get older help them start to sort things by those attributes.

Remember: Every moment of the day is a learning moment for a young child. Your interaction and engagement is what helps them thrive.

It is our mission to ensure that every interaction with staff at the Child Care Resource Centers is positive and professional.

If you have concerns about an incident or some aspect of service at a Child Care Resource Center, please contact the director/manager directly. As the Statewide Coordinating Entity of the Maryland Child Care Resource Network, MFN will investigate the complaint or concern regarding services and take appropriate action.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering webinars to our clients. Webinars will be announced on our training calendar and posted on our website.

Currently, we are not accepting cash, checks, or money orders. You may call with a credit card to pay over the phone. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at <u>thepromisecenter.org/register</u>. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot.

Confirmations will not be mailed. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For our webinars, class participation is required. You must have video and microphone capabilities. Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending the class. Certificates will be mailed upon completion of the assessment.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center **24-hours in advance** and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. ***Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration** or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child. Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well.
