
SUMMER SAFETY



Sun Protection and Insect Repellents

Sunburns and bug bits can be itchy or even painful. To avoid these issues, ask guardians to provide sunscreen and insect repellent in the summer months for each individual child.

Sunscreen and insect repellent are considered "Basic Care Products". An individual does not need to have taken "Medication Administration" training to apply basic care products on a child. Be sure to log when a guardian gives you either product with the child's name, type of product and the date you received it.

Dehydration and Water Activities

Before prolonged physical activity in warm weather, provide water to aid with hydration and encourage children to drink water during any activity. If a child experiences heat exhaustion, have them rest in the shade, sit down, and bend forward at the waist, bringing the head between the knees, or lie down with the feet slightly elevated Apply cool compresses and have water available for those alert enough to drink. Follow emergency procedures by calling 911 and contact parents/guardians

Always make sure there is adult supervision in any situation that includes children and water to reduce risks of drowning. Lifeguard, family child care and child care center staff surveillance zones should be determined in swimming areas.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering both webinars and face-to-face learning opportunities. Classes will be announced on our training calendar and website with the appropriate meeting location - webinar or our office location.

We currently accept cash, checks, money orders or credit card payments for class registration. Please either mail, visit our office, or call in to pay. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at thepromisecenter.org/register. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot. Participants may not reserve a seat without payment.

Confirmations will automatically be sent via email from our class registration service. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class if you do not have an email set up with us.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals past the 15-minute grace period will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For all trainings, class participation is required. For webinars, you must have video and microphone capabilities.

Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending classes.

Certificates will be distributed upon completion of the assessment and evaluation either in-person or via email.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

Please call 301-290-0040 in advance of class if you need assistance or require special accommodations.

All classes are open to the public.

The Promise Resource Center provides low-cost workshops for child care providers, parents and the community. Our workshops meet MSDE/Office of Child Care requirements for Core of Knowledge training.



CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class at any time for reasons such as inclement weather, low registration numbers, etc.

You will receive a call notifying you of any cancellation. A refund or class credit will be issued at that time. Refunds will only be issued upon request if PRC cancels class.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. Once you enter your information, it will be reviewed and activated in our database within just two business days.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well.
