Last year was tough for the child care community, and many have experienced stress in meeting the basic needs for living. Some families and care providers have been experiencing stress in many areas of their lives including work and childcare, getting food on the table, and worrying if they will be able to pay their rent and other bills. Stressful and traumatic events come in different forms, and last year a global pandemic began and is still impacting many of us today.

Infants and toddlers
experience trauma and
stress in a significant way.
This is a time in a child's
life that their brains are
developing so quickly and
the impact of trauma and
stress can lead to

continued social and emotional struggles as they grow older.

One important aspect to remember is that children will react differently to stress and trauma.

Trauma is about perspective, reactions to stress and trauma varies depending on temperament, experiences, as well as the emotional support that children have within their environment.

Young children who are experiencing stress and trauma are often misunderstood. What we may see as behavior that is challenging for us as caregivers, is often times a feeling that the child doesn't quite know how to express. This could be fear, confusion, anger or sadness, and it might be

related to what is going on in that child's world.

So What Can We Do?

- Provide a safe and nurturing environment
- Establish responsive relationships with children and families
- Provide children with predictable routines
- Teach children social, emotional and behavioral emotional skills
- Be responsive to the child's needs
- Try to understand the message of the child's behavior. What is the child trying to communicate?
- Encourage toddlers to use their words to express their feelings

"Babies and toddlers are directly affected by trauma. They are also affected if their mother, father or main caregiver is suffering consequences of the trauma. If their home and routine becomes unsettled or disrupted as a result of the trauma, babies and toddlers are also vulnerable." ~Better Health Channel

HELPING CHILDREN TRANSITION BACK INTO SCHOOL-YEAR ROUTINES



Validate their feelings!

Remind them that it is okay to feel nervous or apprehensive toward going back to school. We all experience unease when our schedules change and back to school transitions are hard for everyone in the family.



Morning routines that are simple!

Make the morning routine as simple as possible. Review what each morning will look like so you and your child have clear expectations. Consider creating a visual board with pictures and encouraging messages to help aid with motivation for the day.

Dedicated homework times!

Find a homework time that works for your family. Some children feel more motivated to do homework as soon as they come home from school. Others do better with an hour or two break after school before working on homework. Keep them motivated by offering positive feedback, assistance and motivation when needed. This may take some time to adjust. Have patience with each other as you work out the best times for your child.

Separate unwinding from bedtime!

Have clear times set aside for relaxing and bedtime. Children are often used to going to bed and waking up later during the summer months. Transitioning their schedule can be difficult. Consider creating a visual aid such as a calendar or clock with color coded times to match a portion of the nightly routine throughout the school year.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering webinars to our clients. Webinars will be announced on our training calendar and posted on our website.

Currently, we are not accepting cash, checks, or money orders. You may call with a credit card to pay over the phone. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at thepromisecenter.org/register. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot.

Confirmations will not be mailed. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For our webinars, class participation is required. You must have video and microphone capabilities. Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending the class. Certificates will be mailed upon completion of the assessment.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

Please call 301-290-0040 in advance of class if you need assistance or require special accommodations.

All classes are open to the public.

The Promise Resource Center provides low-cost workshops for child care providers, parents and the community. Our workshops meet MSDE/Office of Child Care requirements for Core of Knowledge training.



CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

You will receive a call notifying you of the cancellation and your money will be refunded or a credit will be issued.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. Once you enter your information, it will be reviewed and activated in our database within just two business days.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well.
