Fireworks Safety Tips


- ★ Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- ★ Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- ★ Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- ★ Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- ★ Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- ★ Never use fireworks while impaired by alcohol or drugs.

Spike in Fireworks Injuries & Deaths


increase in deaths & injuries compared to 2019

How & When Injuries Occurred





Preparing Your Families First Aid Kit

When preparing your families First Aid kit here is what the American Red Cross Association recommends.

Medical Ointments:

- Hydrocortisone
- Calamine lotion
- Rubbing alcohol
- Hydrogen peroxide
- Hand sanitizing gel
- Burn ointment
- Eyewash solution
- Petroleum jelly
- Saline solution
- Sunscreen
- Sunburn ointment

Medications:

- Fever and pain reducers, for both adults and children*
- Antacids
- Anti-diarrhea medication
- Oral electrolyte solution (such as Pedialyte)
- Mild laxatives
- Antihistamines
- · Cold and/or flu medicines
- Cough medicine
- Prescription medications prescribed to family members
- * For all of these medications, have the appropriate ones in both adult and children's versions. You may also want to add the suppository version of medications incase patient is vomiting.

How to Prepare for Fireworks with a Child who Struggles with Sensory Overload

The month of July can be a very stressful time for many people, including children who may have sensory processing problems. The loud noises, deep vibration feeling, and bright colors from the firework festivities are all overwhelming stimuli that could cause somebody to feel like they are in sensory overload!

Sensory overload may present itself in children as temper tantrums, difficulty focusing, extreme irritability, restlessness and discomfort, and higher levels than usual of sensitivity.

Here are some helpful tips to try and keep sensory overload at bay.

• Bring a 'calm down bag' or create a 'calm down corner' at home:

If you will be celebrating with family and friends, pack a bag with calming tools your child enjoys such as books, fidget toys, coloring books, music, bubbles, sunglasses, or noise canceling headphones for fireworks, etc. If you are at home, create a safe place for your child to relax with pillows and blankets, using dim lighting and peaceful sounds to help relax.

Help prepare your child for the day

Some kids like the predictability of a routine day. Prepare your child with either a visual schedule or use of a social story of the events of the day or expose your child to what they may do, describing the sounds, lights, or the people involved. You can do this by role-playing a BBQ with friends or watching a video on fireworks.

Heavy work for practical use

Heavy work is a great tool to help calm and regulate the sensory system. A great way to get that input is by having your child help prepare for the party! Have them help pack the car, put dishes out on the table, or help with the cooking by rolling out the pie crust or mixing the salad! You can make this task age appropriate for your child by looking up Heavy Work Activities for your child's age

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering webinars to our clients. Webinars will be announced on our training calendar and posted on our website.

Currently, we are not accepting cash, checks, or money orders. You may call with a credit card to pay over the phone. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at thepromisecenter.org/register. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot.

Confirmations will not be mailed. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed. Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For our webinars, class participation is required. You must have video and microphone capabilities. Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending the class. Certificates will be mailed upon completion of the assessment.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

Please call 301-290-0040 in advance of class if you need assistance or require special accommodations.

All classes are open to the public.

CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

The Promise Resource Center reserves the right to cancel a class if, the day prior to the class, we don't have the necessary number of paid participants.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. You can update your record now at https://locate.marylandfamilynetwork.org/Provider/login. Once you enter your information, it will be reviewed and activated in our database within just two business days.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are

recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well. Any questions on this policy should be addressed to FloJean Speck, LOCATE: Child Care Director.
