Summer Safety: Children's Swim Suits

MMMMMMMM


Parents might choose swimwear based on style or comfort, but one new study suggests color is the most important factor. In fact, it could make all the difference in preventing drowning.

In a recent test study, ALIVE Solutions Inc., a company that specializes in aquatic safety, put swimsuit colors to the test to see their visibility in pools.

The top photo in each section is the fabric underwater, and the bottom photo is the fabric with surface agitation.

"The worst two colors are white and light blue (check out how they disappear) and our top choices would be neon pink and neon orange," ALIVE Solutions said in its post. "Although the darker colors show up on a light pool bottom they can often be dismissed for a pile of leaves, dirt, or a shadow so parents should stay away from those colors when possible."





Keeping babies cool in hot weather

Follow these tips to keep your baby cool during hot weather.

Dress light



Dress your baby in light clothing and use layers to adjust to the temperature.

Avoid direct sunlight



Babies under 6 months should not be out in direct sunlight. Use sunscreen for babies over 6 months.

Plenty of fluids



Offer breast milk or formula for babies under 6 months. They may want to feed more often, but for less time.

Use a fan



Use a fan to help circulate cool air. If using an air conditioner, don't let it get too cold.

Cool bath



Give your baby a cool bath, especially before bedtime.

Shade, don't cover



Pram should be shaded, not completely covered to allow air to circulate.

Warning signs for heatstroke

- Rising body temperature above 40°C
- . Heavy sweating that suddenly stops
- Pale, clammy skin
- Rapid heartbeat and breathing
- Headache and muscle cramps

- Sunken fontanelle (soft spot on baby's head).
- Dark urine and not as frequent.
- Dry mouth and eyes
- Being sleep or 'floppy
- Confusion, shortness of breath and vomiting

KEEP EXPLANATIONS DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE

Emphasize students' role in safety & how to access support.

REAFFIRM SAFETY



- · Let children speak about their feelings and validate reactions to the event.
- · Support the appropriate expression of their feelings and help to put them in perspective.

MAKE TIME TO TALK



- · Let children's questions guide the information provided. Be patient and look for clues that a child wants to talk.
- Young children may need concrete activities (e.g., imaginative play) while some older children may prefer writing or playing music.

REVIEW SAFETY PROCEDURES



- · Help children identify an adult at school and in the community that they can go to if they feel threatened
- Review procedures and safeguards in school and home settings.

MONITOR EMOTIONAL STATE

- · Some children will not express themselves verbally but changes in behavior, appetite, or sleep patterns can indicate anxiety or stress.
- · Seek help from a mental health professional for those with more intense reactions that last more than 2 weeks.

MAINTAIN A NORMAL ROUTINE

- Keep a regular schedule and healthy nutrition, sleep and exercise to promote physical and mental health.
- · Encourage maintenance of school work and extracurricular activities but do not push children who seem overwhelmed.
- · Limit exposure to images or graphic reference to the event (e.g., TV and social media)...

BABY FORMULA RESOURCES!



Guidance for families seeking baby formula during the national infant formula shortage

5/16/2022

The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) recommends the following for families in need of formula:

- If your baby needs a special formula, your child health provider can advise you on a comparable formula to use.
- If you are a Maryland WIC participant, contact your <u>local WIC office</u> for assistance locating products or making changes to your WIC food benefits.
- If you are not a Maryland WIC participant, go to the Maryland WIC website to learn how to apply, or call your local WIC office (or 1-800-242-4942) to find out if you are eligible for benefits.
- Do not dilute infant formula. Adding extra water or other liquids to infant formula can be dangerous and even life-threatening for babies, leading to a serious nutritional deficit and health issues.
- Do not use homemade formulas. Formulas made at home often lack the critical nutrients that babies need.
- Use a different brand or type of formula if available. For most babies, it is OK to switch to any available formula, including store brands. Call your child health provider if you have questions.

Infants with special needs

- Families should consult their pediatrician if their infant requires a specialized formula.
- Healthcare providers who provide care for children in critical need of a
 particular specialty formula should contact Abbott Nutrition directly to
 request the product by calling 1-800-881-0876 or visiting their formula
 information and product request form.

Expectant individuals

- If you are pregnant, speak to your OB/GYN about breastfeeding your infant
- The Maryland WIC program also provides <u>breastfeeding support and</u> resources.
- Families feeding a baby with human milk from a source other than the baby's mother should only use milk from a source that has screened its milk donors and taken other precautions to ensure the safety of its milk.

Appendix A. MARYLAND WIC FORMULA SUBSTITUTES

Maryland WIC staff are offering participants with affected products an alternate form (e.g., concentrate or ready to feed) of the current product they have on hand. If the caregiver prefers a product from another manufacturer, USDA has granted a waiver to allow for the provision of an alternate product

If Maryland WIC participants cannot find their usual formula, local WIC staff can change food benefits to offer options¹:

- 1) Participants can purchase different container sizes of the same formula
- 2) Participants can switch to a different form of the formula (e.g. concentrate or ready-to-feed)
- 3) Participants can switch to a different manufacturer (available switches are listed below)

REGISTRATION POLICY

Here at PRC, we have a passion for education and are excited to have you join us in the pursuit of knowledge!

We are now offering webinars to our clients. Webinars will be announced on our training calendar and posted on our website.

Currently, we are not accepting cash, checks, or money orders. You may call with a credit card to pay over the phone. Payment for a class will also be accepted online at thepromisecenter.org/register. Please note that classes must be paid for in advance, so please pay promptly to secure your spot.

Confirmations will not be mailed. Please call 301-290-0040 to verify your enrollment in a class.

You must be present and participate in the entire class to receive a certificate for the clock hours listed.
Classes begin at the stated time and no admittance is permitted 15 minutes after the class has started. Late arrivals will not receive certificates, refunds, or transfers for the class.

For our webinars, class participation is required. You must have video and microphone capabilities. Participation in chats, class discussion and polls are required to receive your certificate. We ask that you eliminate as many distractions as possible when attending the class. Certificates will be mailed upon completion of the assessment.

If you have lost or misplaced a certificate, there is a \$5.00 replacement fee.

All classes are open to the public.

CANCELLATION POLICY

We do not issue refunds if a student cancels their enrollment in a class. If you need to cancel, you must call the Promise Resource Center 24-hours in advance and we will gladly give you a credit for another class. *Cancellations must be made 48 hours in advance for CPR and First Aid and Medication Administration or your payment will be forfeited and no credits will be issued. Our cancellation policy includes webinar registration.

Credit for cancelled classes must be used to attend another class within 60 days of the cancellation or it is forfeited.

LOCATE: Child Care

Every day, parents contact LOCATE: Child Care. Parents need comprehensive information to help them make informed decisions for their child. The more complete and current your information is, the better we can help parents find and choose your program. Please review and update your provider record today. Once you enter your information, it will be reviewed and activated in our database within just two business days.

LOCATE Complaint Policy

Through the LOCATE service, parents share feedback with the LOCATE staff on the programs in the files: licensed child care centers, registered family child care providers and accredited preschools and camps. While this feedback is at times positive, it sometimes concerns complaints parents have about child caregivers. Of course, LOCATE and the Maryland Child Care Resource Network want to use this information in a way that is fair to providers and parents, while protecting children, as well.

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for

Therefore, the LOCATE Complaint Policy was developed and has been in effect since its approval by the Maryland Committee for Children Board in November, 1983. According to this policy, all complaints made to LOCATE about child care providers/facilities are recorded. The type of complaint is then determined:

Less Serious Complaint - No Violation: complaints which do not involve violations of child care regulations; complaints about situations which do not pose a threat to the safety, health or welfare of a child.

Less Serious Complaint Involving Violation: complaints of any violation of Office of Child Care (OCC), Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) regulations, and/or the Health Department which do not pose a threat to the health, safety or welfare of a child.

Serious Complaint: any threat to the immediate health, safety, or welfare of a child.

When a parent calls LOCATE with a complaint, the referral specialist advises him/her to register the complaint directly with the appropriate regulatory agency and/or Protective Services. Names and telephone numbers of the person with whom the parent should speak are provided.

When a Serious Complaint is received concerning one of the providers of facilities in the LOCATE system, no referrals are made by the referral specialists to that provider/facility. The LOCATE Director also communicates with the appropriate regulatory agency personnel about the complaint, and maintains the "hold" on the provider/facility until the agency's disposition of the complaint is known. Should the investigation result in no action, the "hold" status is removed from that provider's/facility's records. Should the license or registration be revoked, the record is removed from the LOCATE files. Providers are advised of LOCATE's actions in writing.

A provider may appeal the LOCATE Director's decision to cease referrals. Appeals are first addressed to the LOCATE Advisory Committee. Final appeals may be made to the board of the Maryland Family Network.

It is the position of LOCATE and MFN that the Complaint Policy is both fair and workable. Safeguards and due process are afforded to the care givers in the files, and parents' and children's rights to safety are addressed, as well.
